After School Enrichment

- We are in our 3rd week and it is going well!
- Next ASE will be a Winter session in February
 - Possible change from 6, 1 hour sessions to 4, 1.5 hour sessions for this upcoming session
 - Makes it easier for parents who can't get here at 4:45pm to pick their kids up
 - Spring break is so early this year and did not want to send info home until after Winter Break
 - Would like to have the session complete by Spring Break
 - Gator Week is the week of March 2nd
- Will make sure to solicit beyond staff to teach ASE classes for the next session

• Treasurer Report

- Harvest Night/Trunk or Treat brought in \$2,716.16, which gives us a profit of \$1.616.18
- Currently, we have no large outstanding expenses.
- Current balance = \$19,860.63
- We have just received the check from Chick-fil-a Spirit Night and more Boosterthon money to deposit.

Principal Report

- The school has received \$10,000 from PTO's Boosterthon earnings
 - An author/illustrator is coming to present to our students in December
 - Enhancements to recess
 - Received a student petition with 100 signatures to install a Gaga Court
 - Octogon-shaped court
 - Students stand inside and play a version of dodgeball
 - There are actual leagues and rules for this game.
 Kids will be able to learn through PE instruction.
 - Cost & Installation
 - \$3,900 for the pit itself
 - 350lb structure, trex-like materials so no splinters

- Not in-ground. Metal posts slide into the base lock
- \$1,800 to have a door added
 - Consensus was that the door was not needed. Kids can jump over it.
- \$2,500 for installation if we want the company to install it
 - If we don't get it installed by the company, it does NOT void the warranty
 - Cub scout pack and their families will do the installation
- Will get the ball moving on ordering and installation, so our students can enjoy it before the dead of winter
 - Location will be caddy corner to both playgrounds
- Shade Sails to put over picnic table area
 - It gets really hot there & will allow more use for the area
- Outdoor Libraries
 - Mr. Williams will be building waterproof libraries
 - One for the garden and one in Vista Woods
 - Trying to get them in other GES student neighborhoods, Shelton's Run, Arbor Glen, Anne's
 - Cost to build is about \$100 each.
 - School will supply the books
 - Promoting the love of literacy
- Whatever money we have left after these purchases will go directly into the classrooms
- November Month of the military family
- Technology Advisory Committee meeting at GES Nov 18th
 - Showcasing our school, how we use chromebooks
 - 1:1 ratio for 1st-5th grade
 - 2:1 ratio for Kindergarten
 - 2nd highest ratio in the county

 - Discusses how we can better include families in volunteer opportunities

- Pancake Breakfast
 - We have a lot of events that run on volunteers
 - Looking for more effective ways to manage the amount of time we demand of teachers outside of their contract hours
 - We have had a drop in parent volunteers people are busy, working, managing other things, want to enjoy the events with their kids
 - It has been very difficult to get the amount of help we need to run events. We do not want to start canceling the events because of it.
 - Pancake breakfast is HIGH demand for volunteers.
 - Staff arrives at 6am to flip pancakes and continue cooking until the end of the event
 - Need 8-10 griddles running about 30 people just do do the cooking aspect (5 hours of shifts)
 - Why do families come to pancake breakfast?
 - Family/community event
 - Raffles, Silent Auction
 - Singing Gators
 - Not sure people come specifically for the 'pancake' part
 - Asked PTO to consider a less time intensive menu, with less of a price tag
 - Previous Cost:
 - To cook pancakes we HAVE to have kitchen staff here to use the GES kitchen – Cost is \$250
 - Custodian is approx \$200
 - Last year, spent approx \$500 on food and \$450 on kitchen staff and custodian
 - With raffles and silent auction, pancake breakfast brought in about \$3,000 last year
 - Vendors are paying \$20 per table to set up
 - Not trying to ruin tradition trying to be mindful
 - Marines can come help
 - They have to be face to face with students and interacting with them
 - They will most likely be helping with games and crafts

■ Ideas

- "Holiday Festival" \$10 flat rate family entry for up to a family of 6
 - Access to vendors, crafts, games, movie, Singing Gators, hot chocolate bar, special guest character, silent auction and raffles
 - Sell concessions at cost to families items with no up-front cooking
 - Ex: Biscuits, chick-fil-a breakfast, bagels, donuts, etc with no up-front cooking
 - Significantly cuts down on the number of volunteers needed
 - Tricky part is knowing how much food to purchase to at least break even

 - 7 stations will be set up throughout the school
 - Erica making games
 - Small prizes
 - Games/Crafts will be open 9am-noon
