#### Welcome

#### **Spirit Nights**

  - o Thank you to all who joined us!
    - Had about 13 students and a few teachers

  - We earned \$68 for our PTO
    - First time ever having a spirit night at Vinny's
    - Not super organized
    - Manager didn't know we were coming even after we confirmed several times
- Spirit Night at U.S. Academy of TKD (March 27<sup>th</sup>)
  - CANCELED due to the D.A.R.E staff vs. law enforcement basketball game
  - We are looking into booking something different for March.
     Stay tuned! If we can't, we'll skip it.
    - Sam's has said they'd allow us to do another one
    - We've brought in more income from spirit nights this year than we projected in our budget
    - Looking to possible schedule one for mid-April instead since March is busy

## Gaga Pit

- Thank you to the Boy Scouts for installing our Gaga Ball Pit! It has been very popular during recess!!
  - o Have there been any injuries?
    - Biggest complaint has been dirt in the eyes

- Some teachers have started a rotation system so only 1 class can use the pit at a time to avoid injuries and too many people participating at once
  - Pit should fit about 20-25 people safely, which is about the size of 1 class
  - Kids know they are not supposed to participate if it's not their day
- Other thoughts
  - The pit becomes very muddy when it rains
    - Is there a way to put a floor on it?
    - Most effective method may be to fill it with mulch – possibly rubberized to further prevent injuries from falling
  - The pit is not in the best location because it is so congested around the playground
    - Intended to have it installed on the opposite side of the playground
    - Monitoring it for the first few weeks to see how it goes and decide if it should be relocated
  - Potential to use next year's boosterthon money to purchase another
    - Will wait and see if there is still a demand for it before making a decision
    - Novelty right now

  - o Did teachers prefer having it 4 weeks vs 6?
    - Pros: Less classes, easier having to stay after school fewer times

- Final tally 61 yes, 1 no
  - o Therefore, PTO will cover the \$1,800 cost for student buses

## **Sweethearts Dance Recap**

- Budget was \$500
  - We came in under budget at \$206.35
- Income \$1,345 before expenses
- Feedback/Thoughts?
  - Marine volunteers weren't as involved as in the past
    - They were blocking doors, watching water areas, etc.
  - Thought there would be more chaperone-like people in the dance, but it was still crazy with kids running around and on bleachers
    - Volunteers didn't feel comfortable correcting people's children if their parents were not correcting their behaviors
    - Could close bleachers going forward and put out chairs for those who need a seat

- Entrance directions need to be more prominent directing people into the right line to pay
- Suggestion to work with Ms. Ranttila to have the kids learn different synchronized dances to encourage more dancing
- Suggestion to have a song for daddy/daughter and mother/son to get parents to participate
- 4 instances where parents or grandparents didn't know they had to stay with their students for the event

- Budget \$750
  - Most goes towards concessions and we make that back
- Friday April 3<sup>rd</sup>
  - o Doors open at 6pm, Bingo starts at 6:30pm

  - o 10 games of bingo with 2 winners each game
    - Kids 4-12

  - Raffle tickets will be for sale
    - 2 for \$1

      - Call winners for smaller items first, more expensive items towards the end
